Turnover: € 7.5 billion in 2014
 to € 8.2 billion in 2015.

work for 31,000 FTEs.



- 2015 63 Sea-going vessels (2014:67).
- order intake was 64 ships (2014:99 ships) with a value of € 693 million (2014: € 1 billion).
- 83% came on behalf of export orders (2014:80%).
- The turnover of the yards amounted to € 5.0 billion (2014: € 4.6 billion).

- Approximately 670 <u>Dutch maritime suppliers</u>, amounted to € 4.2 billion in 2015 (2014:3.8 billion €).
- Shiprepair revenue amounted to € 637 million in 2015 (2014: € 558 million)
- Inland vessels, fisheries and small seagoing vessels
   128 ships In 2015 (2014: 108 ships)

- Super yachts
- 23 super yachts (2014: 22)
  value of € 1.1 billion (2014: € 649 million)
  28 new commands are listed

The order book at the end of December was 72 super yachts (2014: 70 super yachts) with a value of over € 4.2 billion (2014: 4.1 billion €).



- 2015 Royal IHC, lay off 1600 workers
   (487 permanent positions and 1127 temporary jobs).
   2016 an other 425 people lost there jobs. White collars)
- Keppel Verolme, lay off 100 workers
- <u>Heerema</u>, 350 lay offs . (¾ off the population will cut of).
- Suppliers minus 150 problably more
   No work in the Dreggers and Offshore Industrie



- Shiprepair
   Continuous stable
- Inland vessels, fisheries and small seagoing vessels
   Difficult and shrinking
- <u>Naval</u>
  Shot to pieces, ferry small market
- Super yachts
   Super (orders until 2020)



#### **RECOVERY IN 2018**

- 586 ships worldwide in 2016 were ordered. That number takes this year to 790.
- Orders rising to 1300 in 2018. Also for later years.
   (On average over the last 20 years were ordered some 2200, indicates how strong the order flow now has fallen back.)

International shipbuilding sector once again a difficult year. Dutch shipbuilders in deep shit!



What are the additional environmental requirements in the EU SRR compared to HKC?

- Control of any <u>leakage</u>, in particular in <u>intertidal zones</u>
- Handle HM and waste only on <u>impermeable floors</u> with effective <u>drainage systems</u>
- Operate from <u>built structures</u>
- Standards for <u>downstream waste</u> <u>management</u>

In addition: environmental requirements, EU List of approved facilities



#### EY OBJECTIVES HKC & EU SRR

- 1. To reduce or replace hazardous materials.
- 2. To accurately provide an Inventory of Hazardous Materials.
- 3. To make the ship easy to dismantle (environmental friendly).
