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Shipbuilding Issues and Challenges

> Preserving Workforce

- Aging workers and loss of talent due to retirements
- Not enough skilled workers to replace retiring workers
- Encouraging experienced workers to take an active role in training new workers
- Moving into a completely fixed price market

Shipbuilding Issues and Challenges (cont.)

- Remaining competitive against non-union competition
- Subcontracting and temporary employment vs hiring
- Revamping training programs for younger and less experienced Boilermakers
- Continued attack on the Jones Act
- Impact Right to Work Legislation has on union density

Shipbuilding Issues and Challenges (cont.)

- > Technology Advancement
 - Costly to maintain innovative technology
 - Slow evolution of the latest technology
 - Improve efficiencies and flow to meet demands
 - Reconfiguring facilities to provide Robotic Welding

- Partnering with union employers to guarantee training is being modeled to specific needs of the shipyard
