European economy still weak

- Recession 2013 (GDP growth: -0,1%); slightly better in 2014?
- International trade balance positive despite strong Euro, mostly thanks to Germany
- Unemployment rate : 10.7% with very high levels in southern Europe (Spain, Greece >25%; 57% for people under 26)
- Real wages have decreased in 2013 for 18 countries out of 28 But minimum salary implemented in Germany (8,5 € per hour)
- Growing inequalities : UK: the 5 richest families own more than the lower 20%

France (2008-11): the richest 10% got 70% of revenue growth

Precarious work extends

- Growth of unwanted part-time activity (specially for women)
- Agency workers (first out in crisis, first in at recovery
- Low-rights contracts
 - 1 day (Romania)
 - 0 hour (UK)
 - Pre-payment for work court action (UK)
 - 1 €/hour (Germany)
 - Reverse auction for job (Spain)



- Normal work contracts replaced by self employment
- Union rights and workers rights attacked



IndustriAll Europe organisation

IndustriAll Europe created June 2012 #7.5 M. affiliated workers from #200 unions in 39 countries

4 policy committees

Collective bargaining, company policy, industrial policy, social dialogue

11 sector committees

textile, basic metals, pharmacy, ICT, aerospace, automotive, mech., shipbuilding, chemical, energy, defence

ICT committee: 14 countries, including 6 in Special Working Party (Belgium, Finland, France, Germany, Romania, UK)



IndustriAll Europe actions

- Inter-union dialogue, exchange of experiences
- EU lobbying : official statements , meetings EU officials & employers unions
- Supports ETUC bold 10-years investment plan for Europe 2% of GDP, mostly in networks: power, transport, communications
- Fighting for workers rights. Making their voice heard demonstration in Brussels April 4th 2014: fighting for a new path for Europe with investment, quality jobs, equality





Austerity is not the solution

We demand

- A forward-looking industrial policy based on resource and energy efficiency, innovation, sustainable and decent jobs
- Industrial democracy: participation, dialogue and bargaining
- Innovative projects to respond to today's challenges: climate change, energy, mobility and security
- A debate on the future of industry and employment in Europe





UE plan for ICT

- 2000: Lisbon strategy Europe to lead "knowledge economy within 10 years"
- 2010: Digital 2020 (updated 2012, 2013): too oriented towards low cost to consumers
- 2012: Horizon 2020 (in force 2013): €22bn innovation investment over the next seven years : *nanotechnologies, advanced material, micro and nano-electronics, photonics; industrial biotechnology, advanced manufacturing systems*
- Discussed at last European summits (October 2013, March 2014): agenda including *digital economy, innovation and services, NSA, industry revival*
- Not at the expected level despite some progress



ICT issues for workers

- Still many layoffs ... and lack of skills
 - 900,000 unfilled ICT positions in 2020?
- Lack of adequate regulation
 - spectrum
 - Internet (privacy, net neutrality)
 - Intra-Europe and worldwide tax dumping + tax heavens
- Loss of ICT champions. See Nokia => Microsoft, Alcatel-Lucent struggling, Siemens drops telecom activities
- EU independence at risk with challenges from
 - the USA: IT dominance
 - China, South Korea: hardware and software
 - India: software



ICT Sector Committee actions

- Quality jobs: industry mapping project for anticipation of changes 2015- 2020 (DG Employment)
- Pushing UE policymakers (DG Connect, DG Industry) for an meaningful industrial policy
- Pushing for fair practices and reciprocity in international trade (DG Trade)
- Networking:
 - European metalworker unions
 - software and services unions
 - European works councils
 - global alliances (HP)
 - IndustriAll global union

DG= Directorate General, a UE "ministry"
