

### EDB sees a promising future for Singapore's electronics sector

However, the electronics cluster has not been doing well on the production front. Its monthly output contracted for a 21st month in a row in December. It was also the worst-performing industrial sector last year - output plunged 11.3 per cent from 2011.

SINGAPORE - Singapore's electronics sector is a diversified one with a bright future, the Economic Development Board (EDB) said as it unveiled \$6.2 billion in fixed-asset investments committed by electronics firms last year.

This was lower than the \$7.4 billion secured in 2011 and made up 39 per cent of total investments secured in 2012.

However, the electronics cluster has not been doing well on the production front. Its monthly output contracted for a 21st month in a row in December. It was also the worst-performing industrial sector last year - output plunged 11.3 per cent from 2011.

In recent months, this decline stood in sharp contrast to the recovery of Taiwan and Korea's exports and production. Several private-sector analysts have since read this as Singapore not being sufficiently plugged into the handset segment and hence missing out on resurgent demand for smartphones and tablets.



SINGAPORE, Feb 22 (Reuters) - Singapore's economic outlook brightened after fourth quarter growth was revised up substantially, with its young biomedicals sector contributing more to the economy than the electronics sector for the first time.

Singapore's GDP expanded at an annualised rate of 3.3 percent in the fourth quarter from the preceding three months, turning around from the 4.6 percent contraction in the third quarter, according to revised seasonally adjusted data released by the Ministry of Trade and Industry
